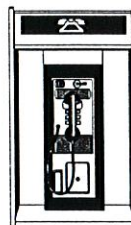
201. The Dare to Care Camporee is **not** insuring (medical or accident) the Camporee participants. As a Pathfinder Club, you're probably insured by your local Conference. The following is the announcement that went out to all the Union/Conference Pathfinder Directors from North American Division Church Ministries Department:

"The DTC office has notified all Conference Pathfinder Directors of the clubs in your Conference who will be attending the Camporee. It is your responsibility to see that each club (Pathfinders and leaders) are properly insured and have documents to support the necessary coverage. Accident (primary and secondary) and/or sickness insurance is available. Because Conference Pathfinder coverage varies, you and your insurance officer need to understand your insurance policy."

Club Directors! Please call your local Conference office today! Find out what your coverage is and make sure you have the necessary documents to support the coverage.

202.. Club Directors! Please tell your Pathfinders' parents to put your **Club's Union, Conference and Club name** on the letters and packages they send to Bandimere Campgrounds. If this information is not on the mail, it will be difficult, if not impossible to deliver mail to the campers. Mail, that is not marked with the Union, Conference, and Club name, will be returned.

208. The earliest time Clubs can enter Bandimere Campgrounds is 12 noon on Monday, August 1. Please realize that activities may not begin until Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday morning. (The Camporee does not officially begin until the Tuesday evening program.) It is the Club Directors responsibility to keep the Pathfinders occupied *before* the activities are open. Here are some pre-Camporee activity ideas.

209. You know that Bandimere's gates open at 12 noon on Monday, August 1 and the Camporee officially begins at Tuesday evening's program. So, what time should you arrive? Think about this:

- A. The shuttles start leaving for Red Rocks at 6 pm, Tuesday evening. They will make two trips and run for approximately 1 1/2 hours. When they are through making their loops, there is no other way to get to Red Rocks. No personal vehicles will be allowed to drive up to the Amphitheatre.
- B. It will take you approximately 45 minutes to one hour to register your club.
- C. You will need to set up your campsite before you go to Red Rocks. When you come back from the evening program, it will be dark.

If you arrive late, for example 5 pm on Tuesday, August 2, here are some suggestions on how to get your Pathfinders to the evening program:

- A. Register your club immediately. (This will be inevitable, you'll have to register before you're allowed on the campsite.)
- B. As soon as your club has their wristbands, send a few adults with them to the evening program.
- C. Have a few adults stay back to set up the campsite.

Several people have asked if they can "register" their club ahead of time to receive their wristbands. The answer is "no". When clubs arrive, we will physically count the club members to make sure they match the number of tickets presented . . . just like Disneyworld!!!

211. SHOWER UPDATE!!!

Options:

- A. We are purchasing a set number of shower bags. We will not be able to send any surplus back. Here's how we're regulating our numbers:

You may receive your first shower bag with a \$10 refundable cash deposit. Whether you have 1 or 10 people registered, you may receive *one* shower bag in this manner.

To receive a *second* shower bag with a \$10 refundable cash deposit, you must have at least 11 members in your club.

To receive a *third* shower bag with a \$10 refundable cash deposit, you must have at least 21 members in your club. And on the formula goes:

1 shower bag = 1-10 people	\$10 refundable
1 additional shower bag = 11-20 people	\$10 refundable
1 additional shower bag = 21-30 people	\$10 refundable
1 additional shower bag = 31-40 people	\$10 refundable
1 additional shower bag = 41-50 people	\$10 refundable

If you'd like to keep the shower bag(s) we issue to you, don't return it and we'll keep your \$10 deposit(s). You'll have bought a \$16.99 (retail) product for \$10!!! What a great deal!

A club will be issued shower bags according to the above formula. This is the only way we can be sure of our shower bag order. Be sure we have your club registered for the correct number of participants! We are purchasing one shower bag for every 10 people. **You do not need to call us and tell us how many shower bags you will be purchasing.** If we have *extra* shower bags, clubs will be able to *purchase* them from us.

- B. If you wish, you can bring your own shower bags, at your expense.

RUMOR MILL vs. THE REAL STORY

Rumor: More than 10,000 Pathfinders can be accommodated at the Dare to Care Camporee.

Real Story: This is *not* true! We can only accommodate 10,000 Pathfinders for the following reasons:

- A. Red Rocks Amphitheatre's capacity is 10,000.
- B. We only have adult support for 10,000.
- C. The Health Department regulates waste and water disposal. It is difficult and expensive with 10,000 people. It would be almost impossible, logistically, with any more than 10,000 at this campsite.
- D. We have limited camping space.
- E. Traffic control, security and safety concerns.
- F. And at least 50 other reasons.

For those who say, "We need more than 10,000 Pathfinders to participate," let's be thankful that 10,000 Pathfinders *can* participate! Let's encourage our leaders to *begin now* on planning a 15,000 person international camporee in 1999!

Facts to Ponder . . .

Dare to Care about your mind and body-

Alcohol remains the most serious problem facing United States high schoolers . . .

High Altitude Cooking Tips

AT ALTITUDES ABOVE 3,000 FEET (914 meters, m), preparation of food may require changes in time, temperature, or recipe. The reason: lower atmospheric pressure due to the thinner blanket of air above. At sea level, the atmosphere presses on a square inch (6.5 square centimeters, cm²) of surface with a weight of 14.7 pounds (65.4 newtons, N), at 5,000 feet (1,524 m) with 12.3 pounds (54.7 N), and at 10,000 feet (3,048 m) with only 10.2 pounds (45.4 N) — a decrease of about ½ pound (2.2 N) per 1,000 feet (305m). This decreased pressure affects food preparation in two ways:

1. Water and other liquids evaporate faster and boil at lower temperatures.
2. Leavening gases in breads and cakes expand more.

The boiling point is that temperature at which the pressure of the water vapor equals atmospheric pressure and the bubbles of water vapor are able to break through the surface and escape into the air. If the atmospheric pressure is less, the temperature required for water to boil is less. Therefore, cooking food in water boiling at this lower temperature takes longer. A "3-minute" egg will take more time. Also, a bowl of boiling soup is not as hot.

Approximate Boiling Temperatures of Water at Various Altitudes:

	Sea level	2,000 ft. (609 m)	5,000 ft. (1,524 m)	7,500 ft. (2,286 m)	10,000 ft. (3,048 m)
Degrees F	212	208	203	198	194
Degrees C	100	98	95	92	90

CAKE MIXES:

Adjustments usually take the form of strengthening the cell walls of the cake by adding all-purpose flour and liquid. Suggestions for high altitude adjustments are provided on most cake mix boxes. Follow these suggestions.

BISCUITS, MUFFINS AND QUICK BREADS:

Quick breads vary from muffin-like to cake-like in cell structure. Although the cell structure of biscuits and muffin-type quick breads is firm enough to withstand the increased internal pressure at high altitudes without adjustment, a bitter or alkaline flavor may result from inadequate neutralization of baking soda or powder. When this occurs, reducing the baking soda or powder slightly will usually improve results.

Quick breads with a cake-like texture are more delicately balanced and usually can be improved at high altitudes by following the adjustment recommendations given above for cakes.

PRACTICAL NOTES CONCERNING BAKING:

1. Flour. Use *any* brand of enriched all-purpose flour (or cake flour, if called for by the recipe).
2. Do not assume that your sea level recipe will fail. Try it first. It may need little or no modification.

Having moved from a low elevation to Denver, I haven't noticed a big difference in my cooking practices. Water boils faster, but food takes a little longer to cook. The only thing I've really been careful with is cakes and roasts. Since you won't be cooking either of these on your stove, you should be fine. -K

1994 Dare to Care International Pathfinder Camporee Day Pass Info, Policies and Procedures

The Dare to Care Camporee will only have 1,000 day passes available for each day of the Camporee. These passes will be pre-sold before the Camporee, just like the \$95 tickets. And as you know . . . THEY WENT FAST!

Day passes are \$10 a ticket for ages 5 and up. A day pass will get you onto the Campsite for the following hours.

9 am to 5 pm- Tuesday-Friday, August 2-5

2 pm to 5 pm- Sabbath, August 6

A day pass **DOES NOT** include:
