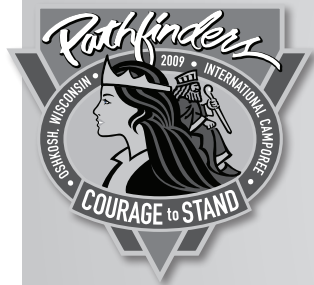

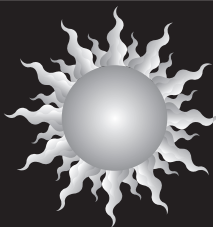



CTS CAMPOREE HYGIENE

General Hygiene

- Wash hands often throughout the day.
- Bring hand-cleaner or wet wipes for use before meals and after use of the portable toilets.
- Sneeze or cough into your shoulder rather than covering your face with a hand.
- Each club, conference, and union is to keep their ground clear of all trash (small or large) at all times.

Toilet Hygiene

- In this country, toilet seats are made to sit on, over the hole or water basin. Paper is used to wipe and put into the toilet. Do not squat on the floor or drop used paper on floor.
- Portable toilets (in rows outside) do not flush. Close the seat when done to keep flies out.

- Toilets in the shower houses must be emptied with water before you leave. Push down on the handle to flush. Always wash your hands at a basin before leaving the bathroom.
- Do not urinate or defecate anywhere other than the toilets. We all want to enjoy camp and leave healthy.

Shower Hygiene

- Showers are made for washing your body.
- Shower for less than five (5) minutes so all get a chance to be clean.
- Never use a shower as a toilet.
- Never use a shower to wash dishes or clothes.

Shower Supervision

- Help keep showers clean by leaving them cleaner than you

- find them. Cleaning personnel will clean down twice daily.
- To help everyone use showers efficiently, all Pathfinders must be accompanied and supervised by an adult staff to enter the shower facility.
- Any person who is already in line for a shower that needs to use the port-a-let is to be allowed to return to their saved spot. Otherwise, no holding spots or cutting in line.
- Please report any bathroom cleaning concerns to the shower personnel who will be on duty from 6:00 am–midnight at each facility.
- No RV’s/camping facilities of any type are to be plugged into any shower facility.

Dear “Courage to Stand” friend,

The medical team is very excited to be a part of another exciting Camporee and we look forward to being of service to you. We have finalized the plans for a safe and successful Camporee and have a few requests of each Pathfinder and Pathfinder club that we believe will help us ensure we are able to provide optimal service to you during this event.

The medical building will be staffed with doctors and nurses 24/7 as well as paramedic teams roaming throughout the grounds to assist with your medical needs. Please contact me with any questions or concerns.

- Please do not independently call an ambulance. Let the medical teams determine when an ambulance needs to be called.
- Develop a system within your club and surrounding clubs that will direct the medical team to your location should the medical team need to respond to your site.
- Please use flashlights during the night to guide the medical team to your site.
- Be aware of your surroundings and make sure that street signs are not removed.
- Instruct your club and sponsors to be sure to move out of the way when medical team golf carts are attempting to get through—especially when sirens are sounding.
- Please complete the “medical form” for each member of your club—Pathfinders and sponsors.
- Please do not ask for rides on the medical team golf carts. These are for medical teams to respond at any given time and we do not want to put passengers at risk.
- Please come prepared for extreme temperatures.
- Please assist your campers by making sure they take all medication as prescribed.

NORMAS DE HIGIENE DEL CAMPOREE

Higiene General

- Lávese las manos durante el día.
- Traiga un desinfectante de manos o líquido antiséptico para usar antes de comer y después de usar los baños públicos.
- Estornude en su hombro en vez de cubrir su boca con su mano.
- Cada club, conferencia/asociación, y unión tiene que mantener su territorio limpio de basura (pequeña o grande) todo el tiempo.

Higiene para el baño

- En este país, los inodoros están diseñados para sentarse sobre la abertura (hueco). El papel higiénico se usa para limpiarse y después se tira en el inodoro. No se agache en el piso o tire papel higiénico usado en el piso.
- Los baños portátiles (en hilera afuera) no tienen manilla/manija para descargar los baños. Cierre la tapa cuando

- termine para que las moscas no salgan.
- Los inodoros que se encuentran en la casa de baño/duchas se tienen que vaciar con agua antes que se retire. Hay una manija/manilla que tiene que empujar. Siempre lávese las manos en el lavadero antes de salir del baño.
- No orine o defeque en ninguna parte excepto en el inodoro. Todos queremos disfrutar el campamento e irnos saludables.

Higiene de duchas

- Las duchas están diseñadas para lavar el cuerpo.
- Báñese en menos de cinco minutos para dar a todos la oportunidad de estar limpios.
- Nunca use la ducha como si fuera el inodoro.
- Nunca use las duchas para lavar ropa o platos de comer.

Supervisión de las duchas

- Deje la ducha mas limpia de como la encontró. Las personas encargadas limpiaran dos veces al día.
- Para el uso eficiente de las duchas, se le pide a todos los clubes que envíen sus conquistadores jóvenes acompañados por un adulto.
- Si una persona esta en línea para las duchas y necesita ir al baño, esta puede volver a su espacio reservado en la línea. En otras ocasiones, no se permite guardar espacios o cortar la línea.
- Reporte cualquier preocupación sobre la limpieza del baño a la persona a cargo que estarán sirviendo desde las 6:00a.m hasta las 12:00 de la noche en cada instalación.
- Ninguna clase de RV’s o instalaciones para acampar se pueden conectar (enchufar) en ninguna de las casas de baño.

Off-site Community Outreach

Community Outreach is available for Pathfinders who would like to transform some of their Camporee excitement into service. Here are some of the events lined up for clubs to plug into.

Little Oshkosh

The chance to help refurbish playground equipment will be available through the Little Oshkosh project. Little Oshkosh is one of the largest wooden playgrounds in America and is located on Lake Winnebago. Pathfinders are invited to assist in the refinishing of the park. Tasks will include painting, sealing and sanding park equipment.

Heckrodt Wetland Preserve

Another opportunity for service unfolds in the Heckrodt Wetland Preserve. This urban nature preserve includes cattail marsh, wetlands, open water, open fields and upland forest. Pathfinders are being asked to help with various assignments around the wetland preserve.

The Paine Art Center and Gardens

The Paine Art Center and Gardens is a museum for learning and inspiration. The site features numerous display gardens as “galleries” of horticultural art. The gardens contain thousands of plant specimens. Pathfinders are being asked to assist with projects in the gardens.

Parks in Neenah

There are three parks in the Town of Neenah—Wilderness, Carpenter Reserve and Memorial, where we have been asked to do brush removal, drag the brush to the curb and stack it, and do some weeding. This is an opportunity to make a difference in these parks and make them more beautiful for residents and visitors to enjoy.

Sheldon Nature Center Invasive Species Removal Project

At the Sheldon Nature Center, invasive plants have become problematic in the nature area. These plants spread and suffocate the native species. Pathfinders have an opportunity to work along trails clearing invasive plants.

All participants for these projects should bring water, insect repellant, work gloves and sunscreen. Most importantly, Camporee officials say that project doers should bring a smile. The number of Pathfinders and staff needed for the projects varies. Pathfinder clubs should attend with an appropriate amount of club leaders or staff. Any further questions about the projects can be answered by Bill Wood, offsite director, or Joe Watts, community service director.

Picking a Theme Song

One of the most enjoyed camporee traditions is the learning of the camporee theme song. The theme song is one of the most effective ways in which the main idea of the camporee is transmitted to Pathfinders. These memorable tunes follow Pathfinder clubs long after the days at Oshkosh have concluded and are often kept alive by singing and listening until the next camporee. Theme song singing and creation dates back to the first camporee in 1985 at Camp Hale, Colo. That year, the theme song was “We Are His Hands.” In 1989 at the Friendship Camporee in Pennsylvania, the tune, “We Are His Colors” was introduced. Since the Friendship Camporee, theme song titles have consistently been the same as the Camporee name—“Dare to Care” in 1994 at Denver, “Discover the Power” in 1999 at Oskosh, Wis. and “Faith on Fire” in 2004, also at Oshkosh.

Finding the right theme song is a work that requires lots of searching through lots of creativity. Harvesting one song from a field of talented submissions means a lot of narrowing down. The theme song contest opened with an invitation for participants to create an easy-to-learn, Christ-centered song which incorporated the Camporee theme in its lyrics. Participants had until February 2, 2009 to enter their submissions. After the deadline passed, a theme song committee was appointed and reduced 100 song options down to 10. The top ten songs were posted in mp3 form on the Camporee website giving people the chance to experience the tunes and then emailing feedback to the committee to assist with the decision process. On April 3, 2009, ten became two as the committee called on voters to help them decide between the top two picks. Over 700 voters e-mailed the committee with feedback.

One week later, Emily Beth Bond was named as the winner of the theme song search. Her song “Courage to Stand” was officially announced as the camporee theme song on April 10, 2009. Bond’s lyrics and an mp3 version of the song are posted on the Camporee website and Camporee officials encourage everyone to listen to the piece and learn the words.

Nathan Greene Artwork to be Unveiled

More than three years ago, Ron and Betty Whitehead approached Dan Houghton, president of the Hart Research Center in Fallbrook, Calif., with a vision. They wanted to commission an original artwork by Christian artist Nathan



Greene that would visually represent the experience and teaching of the Camporee for Pathfinders to take home with them. Last year an agreement on the visual direction was finalized and Greene began his research. He spoke with the staff at the Andrews University Horn Archaeological Museum and perused reference books provided by them to get a sense of the time period. Some of the

objects portrayed in the painting were also from references in those books. Greene says, “I tried to make everything as authentic as possible.”

One of the actors who auditioned for the role of Esther was chosen from four or five potential models to pose for the poster. Jennifer Shrestha, sophomore behavioral sciences major at Andrews University, is half-Nepalese and embodied the Persian look. She also knew how to wear the sari, provided by Sarah Raman, a native of India.

The poster portrays what might have been going on in the mind of Esther while she served as the queen of Persia. Greene states, “The whole theme of Courage to Stand speaks to having integrity, faith in God’s leading and the courage to stand for Him in a secular environment. We have a choice, and I hope that CTS Camporee participants will remember Esther’s example whenever they look at this piece.”

Greene used an oil wash mixed media technique in rich, deep colors, making for a beautiful keepsake to take home with you. Poster prints and trading pins are available for sale in the Honors Building. Make sure to get yours before they run out.



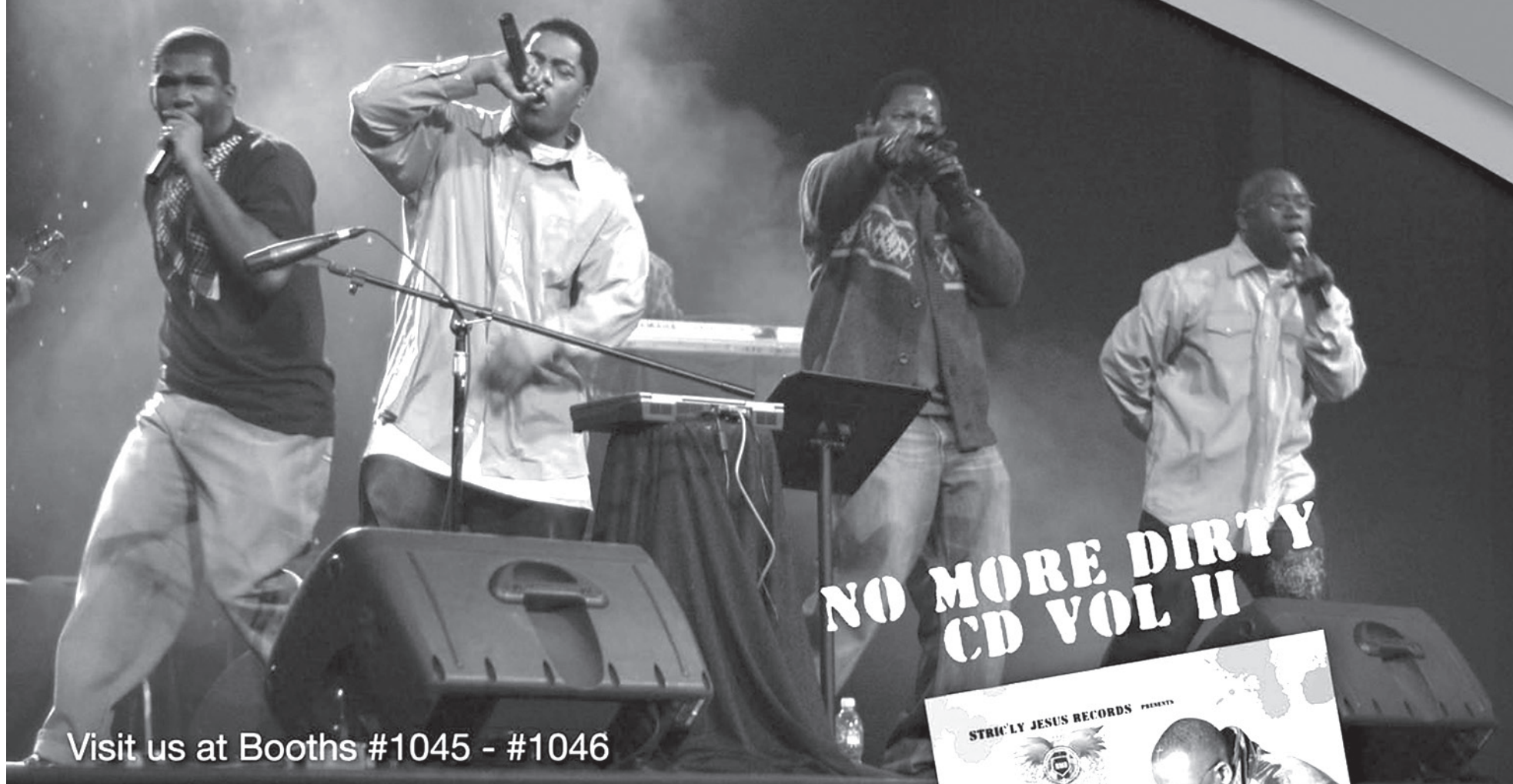

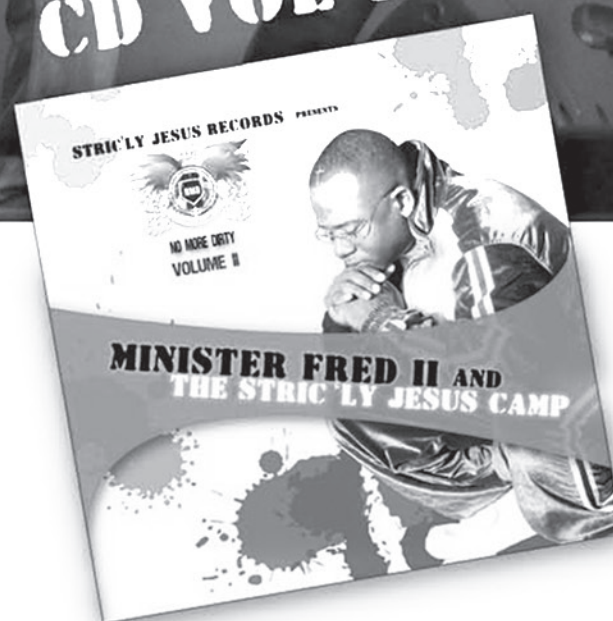
