DAILY DEVOTIONAL

Receive to Give

Ever heard the saying, "Use it or lose it"? I just discovered the missing link. Before I lose it...here's the big idea (thanks, Dad, for sharing).

God gives—to each of us, no exceptions. We receive—we can accept or reject the gift of God's love and grace, but God never stops offering. God's kingdom is built on the principle of receiving to share, or getting to give.

Jesus explained why he was sending his disciples out to help others like this: "Freely you have received, freely give" (Matthew 10:8). Paul adds: "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Nature gives, as it receives. In the water cycle, rain collects in rivers, ponds and



oceans, which evaporate to form clouds that bring more rain in a continuous cycle. A planted seed grows...to produce new seeds. The Bible continues the cycle with this

cause-and-effect statement: "if you do not plant, you will not harvest" (Galatians 6:7).

Unplugging a lamp breaks an electrical circuit, resulting in darkness. "What's in it for me?" focuses on getting to keep. Hanging on to what we have prevents us from growing in new ways. Receiving to keep breaks the receiving-to-share cycle, separating us from others and from God, the Giver of life.

Like a circle, a cycle has no beginning or end. Newton's Law of Motion in physics says it this way: "For every action, there will always be an equal or even opposite reaction." A jug of water can't be refilled until you pour it out—or share it. How can we receive more of what God wants to give us, if we never give it away? We get to give. And when we step out and give, we get—surprise and joy guaranteed!

On earth, Jesus didn't have wealth or power or popular friends. But he shared the little he had—bread and fish, mud and water—to help those around Him understand God's love and care.

I believe Mordecai discerned God's leading when he asked Esther, "Who knows but that you have come to royal position for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14). In response to Mordecai's loving care, Esther risked her life for the life of her people.

Giving unselfishly is often a tough choice, like Esther faced. But God gives each of us just what we need to serve whomever He brings into our lives.

After Camporee is over, think about all you've received. How will you share it with others? You can make a difference—wherever you live, whatever your situation! God GAVE His only Son—for you. (John 3:16)

We receive to give. It's God's way of linking us to His endless love. When we give as freely as we have received, we enjoy life to the fullest.

Why settle for less?

Bus accident threatens Genesis 806 Pathfinder Club from Texas



The Genesis 806 Pathfinders from the Texico Conference in Amarillo, Texas, were traveling back to Andrews University from St. Joseph, Mich., on Friday evening, August 7, when their plans were suddenly threatened.

The group of 28 Pathfinders and 11 staff were happily singing praise songs in the bus, unaware of the approaching danger. While the group's director, Raul Nevarez, was driving the bus around a curve, he noticed a flashing light just a moment too late.

"We didn't see another vehicle, and by the time we knew what was happening, it was too late," describes Manual Rodriguez, the group's pastor.

In an instant, the bus was hit head-on near the driver's side by an ap-

proaching pickup truck. The bus jerked to a stop and, thankfully, remained standing.

"I remember singing, 'Holy, Holy, Holy' in the back when suddenly I bounced into the seat in front of me and hit my neck. Then I bounced back towards the window and back and forth again. I don't remember what else happened, only that I couldn't breathe and that they took me outside," says Evelyn Rubio, a Pathfinder on board.

With several kids in pain, others in shock, and some panicking, Rodriguez and Nevarez tried to keep the Pathfinders calm until the police and an ambulance arrived. Everyone was taken to the hospital and checked out by a doctor, some receiving CAT scans and X-rays. At the end of a very long night, everyone seemed to have come through

with only minor bumps and bruises.

The group remained at the hospital from 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. Sabbath


Esther

TLTs to Receive Special Volunteer Pin

For the first time in Pathfinder history, campers will have the opportunity to receive a special Teen Leaders in Training (TLT) pin for their volunteer work at this year’s Oshkosh Camporee. The TLT team consists of staff members and teenage Pathfinders who carry leadership responsibilities in their clubs. These responsibilities can include Bible bowls and camporees, among other events, and are designed to nurture leadership skills among the older Pathfinders of the church.

This week at Oshkosh, nearly 150 TLTs from clubs around the world have agreed to help with onsite parades, EAA museum security, select honors, collecting Bibles, water distribution on Sabbath morning and food and ice concession. These helpers are easily identifiable in their bright yellow staff vests

as service-oriented volunteers. Each TLT will work three one-half day shifts, and in doing so, will receive the special TLT volunteer pin for their uniform sash. These one-of-a-kind pins are **not** for trade and very few Pathfinders will ever receive one.

“The TLT program is training the youth to become leaders,” says Jose, TLT coordinator. “In the process of training them, one of the things we [TLT staff] would like to do is give them the chance to participate in leadership roles. The TLTs are the helpers of the volunteers that we have here, and if anyone at Oshkosh aspires to volunteer, this is a great starting point.”

The team is looking to fill nearly 50 more positions with Pathfinders ages 13–17, regardless of previous TLT experience. morning when Martin Bradfield, director of transportation at Andrews University, brought a bus to take them back to where they were staying on campus. After discussing new plans, the leaders agreed with the Pathfinders that even though their bus was totaled, there was no turning back now—repeating their mantra to “drive, run or crawl!” to Oshkosh.

“Even though it was hard, we knew that God wanted us to depend on Him and that He had a purpose for us to be here,” says Marco Sanchez, a group member.

The Pathfinders were able to find a ride with a group coming from Andrews. They arrived Monday afternoon, but are still unsure how they will return to Texas at the end of the week. “We don’t plan accidents,” says Rodriguez, “and there are some kids here who need to learn how to handle certain things in life and understand that you can’t go through life only hoping that everything will be okay. We’ve been having devotions and keeping those ideas in mind. We’re really trying to make the best out of it.”

Family donates nearly **42** inches to Locks of Love

Sisters Ashley and Shannon and their mother, Debbie Greek, are not new faces in Oshkosh. Five years after their first Camporee, however, they are sporting new hairdos.

The family has been active with Pathfinders in the Florida Conference for many years. During the 2004 Oshkosh Camporee, Shannon, the oldest sibling, was impressed to donate her hair to Locks of Love, a non-profit organization that provides hairpieces for children who suffer from medical hair loss.

“I didn’t even plan it!” recalls Shannon. “I just showed up, saw the booth, and decided to donate. I had never had my hair short before, and it was such an impulse thing to do.”

After cutting off about 16 inches from her waist-long hair, Shannon’s younger sister, Ashley, was impressed to donate, as well.



Because her hair was too short to donate at the time, she decided to let it grow for five more years and is cutting it for the first time this morning at 11 a.m. in Hanger B, booth 5, alongside her mother and older sister.

When asked about her decision to donate, Ashley says, “When I found out that my mom and sister were cutting theirs, I didn’t want to feel left out! I wanted to do it, too, so we decided we would grow our

hair out together and donate it this week.”

The experience has taught the girls many things about helping others and developing a strong relationship with Christ. Both girls are excited to share their stories with their family and friends who will ask about their short hair when they return home.

“It will be the perfect opportunity for us to explain what Locks of Love is and Camporee, too,” agree the girls.

“I’ve always felt that as Christians, it’s important to help others. There are many people out there who have so many misfortunes, and it’s our responsibility to do what we can to make their lives better. That’s part of what we’re here for,” says Debbie.

Rare Trading Pins

Pin trading at Pathfinder events is a highly-anticipated activity. Clubs from all around the world get excited about the opportunity to collect and trade shining commemorative pieces of their interactions with other clubs and conferences. Like with any item on which worth is measured, several components determine the value of a trading pin. Quantity is the foremost component

and low numbers of a particular pin, by default, make it rare. Pins from smaller conferences such as Alaska, North Dakota, and Mountain View can be more sought-after since these conferences have lower populations. However, owning a pin from a small conference isn't the only way to grab a rare decoration. Larger conferences have made their more prevalent pins rarer by creating them in sets which send Pathfinders on a hunt to collect them all. Other additions which have hiked demand for pins include the installment



of blinking lights, whirling fans, odd shapes and eye-catching color combinations. Age can also increase requests for pins. A vintage pin is likely to have an historical edge on more recent creations. Lastly, pins with an unconventional history associated with their quantity become popular quickly. An interesting situation surrounded some Oklahoma pins at the last Camporee.

- According to Bob Holbrook, director of youth ministries at the Oklahoma Conference, the Oklahoma Conference issued six pins featuring five Native American nations and one composite. However, legal authorization to use the Native symbols featured on the pins was not acquired. While some of the pins were distributed, most of them were recalled, leaving very few full sets available. This situation gave the pins somewhat of an overnight high-demand status.
- Even though deciding which pins are the rarest is largely a subjective process, the information listed in this article may help you decide how prized your pins are. Listed below are the five most popular pins in the past. Check out the website www.pathfinderpins.com for a peek at some photos of lots of trading pins.
- Pennsylvania Black Border Pin**—This pin was propelled into rarity because it was an error—it was intended to have a gold border.
 - Flags at Faith on Fire Pin**—Introduced at the 2004 Camporee, this pin features the Pathfinder flag waving above the Faith on Fire logo along with the words, “was here.” It is encircled by 20 national flags.
 - Bermuda Gold Flag pin**—This pin was introduced during the 1989 Friendship Camporee and was a hot item during a year when state and international flag pins were sought. One Bermuda Gold Flag pin reportedly sold for \$50.
 - Oklahoma Dreamcatcher**—This Oklahoma Conference pin was big because it was one of the first pins to be designed with a hanging attachment. The unique design caused hype at the Discover the Power Camporee in 1999.
 - Michigan Conference Rainbow Pin**—This pin was a hot item at both Discover the Power and Faith On Fire Camporees. It is the final piece in a Michigan Conference color series which features all the colors of its coordinating pins. Several Conferences and Unions put pins in sets.

TOP TEN nighttime tips

1. **Special PowerPoint Souvenir Journal.** Thanks to the Review and Herald Press with the General Conference Sabbath School Department, every person attending Camporee will have their own Journal, packed with lots of fun facts and thoughts to connect you with the life of Esther. We recommend that you read the story of Esther in the Bible all week long.
2. **Gates open.** Gates open at 7pm each night. Please note on Saturday, the gates will be open all day, starting at 9am.
3. **Seat Saving.** This is not permitted—come early with your group and bring chairs.

Special Needs. Northeast entrance is the handicap entrance for the nighttime program. It will be open at 6:45p.m. each night and at 8:45a.m. Sabbath morning.

4. **Bible collection.** This will be available at the southern entrance to the nighttime area.




