Walk the walk



Her initial connection with the CTS Camporee stems back to her time as Japhet De Oliveira's assistant when he was youth director in the U.K. He called her and encouraged her to audition for the Camporee drama. When she was selected to play the role of Abigail it meant she had to quit her job to come to the U.S. for rehearsals. Even though her character doesn't actually exist in the Biblical account of Esther's life, playing the role of Abigail, Esther's closest Jewish childhood friend and confidant, allows us to see another side of the story.

Although Esther's story takes place in an ancient time period, Jadanna believes that the issues today are still the same. How do I show what I believe? Where do I fit in? Her passion for helping others find answers to those important questions has led her to start a youth ministry company, No Labels Academy. She and her business partner are developing workshops and seminars focusing on music, art & design, drama and spiritual skills. They plan to offer them to schools, churches and the community, training teens to lead out as well. Their goal is to understand and accept teens where they are and help them develop a strong foundation in what they believe.



8. Do you have any words of advice for our campers out there about how they can make the most out of their Camporee experience?


Toby: They HAVE to go see Bongo the puppet and his friend, Puppy, out by the Hangars and the rock wall. Puppy's my favorite!

Heidi: Yeah! Or just talk to people, and find out where they're from. We're all here for one purpose.







"God is here, God is here," says Alvina Cook, a volunteer staff from Minnesota. Alvina has been spending her week in Hangar D helping Pathfinders obtain their scrap-booking honor. On Wednesday, August 12, she was struck by the kindness of the Guerros PF Club from Houston, Texas, towards the Cruzeiro Do Sal PF Club from Brasilia, Brazil.

"The Brazilian club was interested in scrap-booking," says Alvina. "But they needed an interpreter because none of us [volunteers] speak Portuguese. When the Texan club walked in, we found out they had someone who spoke Portuguese and was willing to translate."

Each club had seven Pathfinders, so the groups rearranged their schedules and agreed to meet at the scrap-booking section at the same time. Together, they've been working towards their honors.

"I was so touched that the [Guerros] club was so willing to help," says Alvina. "They were doing what Pathfinders should be doing. It really touched my heart."

"Miracle Man" Survives Car Accident

It was just another August day for 20-year old Alex Briceno from the Westminster Good Samaritan Church in California. He was doing his job working as a driver and delivery man for a plumbing company when disaster suddenly struck.

The Briceno family is still unsure of exactly what happened. It is speculated that as Alex was on a ramp changing from one freeway to another, he came to a sharp turn and lost control. The vehicle rolled into a ravine and was stopped by a tree from hurling into oncoming traffic. The entire passenger side was instantly destroyed, as well as the front. Oddly enough, every seat in the vehicle was crushed, except for Alex's.

Alex was rushed to the Los Angeles USC hospital. His family, who had been panicking all afternoon about their missing son/brother, was called later that evening and arrived to see him hooked up to countless tubes with cuts, bruises and scrapes covering his entire body. His jaw was broken, and his clavicle and AC joint were dislocated.

"There was so much trauma to his brain. They told me he wasn't going to make it," says Rose Briceno, Alex's mother. "The doctor told me, 'I hope the best for your family, but he's done."

Alex remained in a coma for nearly four weeks, his family by his side and their church in constant prayer. He had been moved to a different facility by this time and if he ever did fully awaken, was expected to remain in an

"infant" stage for the time being. Some of his first words were, "Mom! Dad!" and "God!"

During this time, Alex's family encountered several other families and individuals in need of their faith and prayer. Alex's father talked with gang members in the hospital whose friend had been killed. He prayed with them, and helped to prevent a revenge murder from occurring. Rose also had several opportunities to pray with hurting families and friends, changing countless lives as well as transforming her own.

Just three months after the accident, Alex was walking and talking on his own. On November 26, 2008, he was sent home for good.




"I've been blessed through everything," he claims. "Hospital trauma, rehab, therapy...and I had the best family through it all. I plan on going home and getting 100% better, and if I don't, I know it's because God works on His own time, not mine."

"The day I saw my son in that hospital," says Rose, "I knew I had to give him up. There was nothing I could do for him. I had to hand him over to God. I lost my son that day."

Alex was recently baptized and plans to tell his testimony to the new friends he's been making at camp this week.

"If anyone wants to see an actual miracle, come find me!" he says. "I'll be wearing my white and red USMC hat!"


